Stepfamilies: Barriers to Integration

The unique heterogeneous nature of stepfamilies based on their variable life histories and composition produces complex and often problematic interrelationships that distinguish stepfamilies from other family forms. This power point presentation identifies stages of stepfamily development, focuses on possible barriers to successful integration, and delineates appropriate strategic interventions using family systems perspective proven to be effective when working with this segment of population. Based on published literature and presenter's professional and personal experiences, examples of presenting problems from single case studies, in addition to assessment guidelines, will assist therapists identify signs and symptoms indicative of stepfamily treatment.

ART THERAPY WITH GRIEF AND LOSS

Presenter: Katharyn Morgan, MFT, RCAT (Registered Canadian Art Therapist)

Losses of all kinds can undo us, shake our sense of identity, and leave us wandering in the unfamiliar landscape of our own lives. Recovering from grief requires us to actively address these changes, to find new maps, and to weave the story of loss into the larger story of our ongoing lives. Using art therapy allows the grief to be externalized in a concrete form that can serve as a mirror for the inner experience, a map of resources, and as a guide for healing. In my work with grieving adults and families, art-making has been a stepping stone to words. It has provided validation of the impact of loss and has often been a springboard for new beginnings and a sense of hope. In this workshop we will explore the interface between grief work and art therapy. It will include an overview of some current models of grief, an introduction to the role of art-making, some case study images, and some hands-on activities with art materials.

Objectives:

At the end of this workshop, participants will be able to:

1. Identify current theoretical models of grief work.
2. Understand the role of art-making in addressing grief & loss.
3. Use specific art activities to facilitate exploration and resolution of grief.

Long ago and far away...well not so long or far but I did most of my education and counseling experience in Canada before moving to San Diego almost 9 years ago. In Canada I completed a BA (U of Alberta, 1970) followed over the years by a Diploma in Child Assessment & Counseling (U of Toronto, 1982) and a Diploma in Art Therapy (Kutenai Art Therapy Institute, 2000). With 25 yrs counseling experience I moved here and was unable to practice until I completed an MA in Counseling (National University, 2005) followed by the requisite 3000 hrs and 2 exams, finally licensed in Jan 2010! In Canada I worked with children, families, and adults in various mental health settings and private practice. In San Diego I spent 5 years with San Diego Hospice Bereavement Program, first as an MFT trainee and then an employee. Since Jan 2010 I have been in private practice with an office in Bankers Hill, providing individual, couple, and family counseling and support groups for 1) adults dealing with loss & transitions and 2) professional helpers seeking to establish resilience using mindfulness practices, art-making, and dialogue with peers. Although art therapy is an integral part of my work, I see some clients for whom talk therapy is just right plus I use skills developed through body-centered psychotherapy, EMDR, and mindfulness practices.

HOW TO REGISTER FOR A SAN DIEGO CHAPTER OF CAMFT WORKSHOP
